



## Introduction



These regulations establish season lengths, tag requirements, hunting areas, special restrictions and bag limits regarding general hunting opportunities for cougar, bear, Roosevelt elk, black-tailed deer, small game, upland birds and waterfowl.

In addition to these annual regulations, the Quinault's Title 51 (Fishing/Hunting/Gathering) contains requirements pertaining to eligible hunters, permits, firearms restrictions, enforcement, violations, and criminal offenses.

Restricted Hunting Areas (Limited Entry): Restricted Hunting areas are limited to Senior Citizens (Elders 55 years and older) and disabled hunters only. These areas are closed to all other hunters for the 2025-26 hunting season, including non-elder and non-disabled archery hunters.

#### **RESTRICTED ELK HUNTING AREAS:**

- Quinault River Areas accessed by F-17: The clearcut units near the Quinault River accessed by F-17 and bounded by allotments 36, 37, 301, 759, 24, 25, 293, 288, and 517.
- Mouth of Raft River: Clearcuts along the first 2.5 river miles on the south side of Raft River, clearcuts along the first 3.25 river miles on the north side of Raft River, and the first 2.5 river miles of the Raft River riverbottom, and bounded by allotments 2210, T3066, 1949, 2008, 2007, 403, 402, 401, 473, 250, 1957, 1625, 448, 450, 406, 1718, T3029, 404, 449, 1607, 1609, and 1284.
- <u>Clearwater Road</u>: Clearcuts on the west and east sides of Clearwater Road, beginning at US Highway 101 and ending at the Clearwater Bridge, and bounded by allotments 113, 20, 1713, 112, 111, 253, 114, and 1944.

#### AREAS CLOSED TO ALL HUNTING:

- 1. QUINAULT BEACH RESORT & CASINO AREA
- 2. Any incorporated or unincorporated cities: No hunting in city limits
- 3. No hunting within 100 yards of an inhabited dwelling.
- 4. No hunting within 500 yards of Taholah and Queets Villages.
- 5. Haynisisoos Point/Point Grenville Recreational Area.

- \*Each person may harvest a total of 2 elk On- OR Off-reservation COMBINED. Only 1 of the 2 elk may be harvested on-reservation. Both elk may be harvested off-reservation if desired. On-reservation elk harvest is restricted to bulls only, except for elders and disabled hunters. Off-reservation elk harvest may include one cow.
- \*\*Each person may harvest a total of 3 deer On- OR Off-reservation COMBINED. Only 1 of the 3 deer may be harvested on-reservation. All 3 deer may be harvested off-reservation if desired. On-reservation deer harvest is restricted to bucks only. Off-reservation deer harvest may include one doe.
- \*\*\*Designated hunting for elk is not permitted on-reservation. Designated hunting for deer is permitted on-reservation.

Animal remains, carcasses, gut piles, hides and leavings shall not be left in any public place within 500 yards from any inhabited site, dwelling or public areas including Point Grenville, the cemetery, and community housing areas.

Type of Hunt: General Hunting Season

Bag Limit: \*1 Bull

Open Hunting Area: Quinault Indian Reservation

Bull Season: October 15th through December 31st, 2025

Type of Hunt: Elder/Disabled Only Cow Hunt
Bag Limit: 1 Cow (Non-Antlered, Female)
Open Hunting Area: Quinault Indian Reservation

Cow Season: September 1st through September 30th, 2025

Other Restrictions: COWS on-reservation may ONLY be harvested by individuals

who qualify as an ELDER or DISABLED

\*Each person may harvest a total of 2 elk On- OR Off-reservation COMBINED. Only 1 of the 2 elk may be harvested on-reservation. Both elk may be harvested off-reservation if desired. Off-reservation elk harvest may include one cow.

\*\*Archery hunters are prohibited from carrying a rifle on their person or in their vehicle at any time while bow hunting on-reservation. Archery hunters may carry a handgun for protection but are prohibited from hunting with a firearm while bow hunting on-reservation.





### **Black-Tailed Deer**

Type of Hunt: Elder/Disabled/Archery\*\* Only Buck Hunt

Bag Limit: \*1 buck (antlered)

Open Hunting Area: Quinault Indian Reservation

Buck Season: August 1st through October 14th, 2025

Doe Season: No Doe Season On-Reservation

Type of Hunt: General Hunting Season

Bag Limit: \*1 buck (antlered)

Open Hunting Area: Quinault Indian Reservation

Buck Season: October 15th through December 31st, 2025

Doe Season: No Doe Season On-Reservation

\*\*Each person may harvest a total of 3 deer On- OR Off-reservation COMBINED. Only 1 of the 3 deer may be harvested on-reservation. All 3 deer may be harvested off-reservation if desired. On-reservation deer harvest is restricted to bucks only. Off-reservation deer harvest may include one doe.

\*\*Archery hunters are prohibited from carrying a rifle on their person or in their vehicle at any time while bow hunting on-reservation. Archery hunters may carry a handgun for protection but are prohibited from hunting with a firearm while bow hunting on-reservation.



#### **Black Bear**

Type of Hunt: General Hunting Season

Bag Limit: Unlimited

Open Hunting Area: Quinault Indian Reservation

Open Season: Open Year Round

Other Restrictions:

Bear bait sites locations must be reported to the Fish and Game Office within 3 business days of installation. Any drums or barrels must be marked with the hunter's enrollment number. If using natural substrates to bait, sites must be marked with flagging or ribbon. The use of dogs to hunt bears is not authorized as stated in Title 51, except by special regulations.

The QDNR Wildlife Section requests that hunters submit the first pre-molar of each bear harvested to the Fish & Game Office. The Wildlife Section ages black bears through cementum analysis of submitted tooth samples and will provide the results to hunters who submit teeth.

## Cougar

Type of Hunt: General Hunting Season

Bag Limit: Unlimited

Open Hunting Area: Quinault Indian Reservation

Open Season: Open Year Round

Other Restrictions:

The use of dogs to hunt cougars is not authorized as stated in Title 51, except by special regulations. Hunting cougars over bait is ALLOWED.

Successful hunters may present the pelt or skull of the harvested cougar to the QDNR Wildlife Section for examination of age and sex.



## **Upland Birds**

Type of Hunt: General Hunting Season

Bag Limit: Ruffed, Blue or Spruce Grouse (5 per day)

Band-Tailed Pigeon (2 per day)

Open Hunting Area: Quinault Indian Reservation

Open Season: July 18th, 2025 through February 28th, 2026
Additional Restrictions: Must report harvest to the Fish & Game Office.

#### Small Game

Type of Hunt: General Hunting Season

Bag Limit: Rabbit and/or Snowshoe Hare (5 per day)

Coyote (Unlimited)
Bob Cat (Unlimited)

Open Hunting Area: Quinault Indian Reservation

Open Season: Open Year Round

Additional Restrictions:

Use of .22 Caliber Rifles is ALLOWED for small game. Must report harvest to the Fish & Game Office.



#### **Waterfowl**

Type of Hunt: General Hunting Season

Bag Limit: Ducks (7 per day)

Geese (5 per day)

Open Hunting Area: Quinault Indian Reservation

Open Season: September 20th, 2025 through January 29th, 2026

Firearm Restrictions:

Only shotguns may be used to hunt waterfowl. The use of lead shot is prohibited. Only lead shot substitutes or alternatives are allowed.

Other Restrictions:

Whistling and Trumpeter SWAN hunting is CLOSED year round. Must report harvest to the Fish & Game Office.

### **Mountain Goats**

Type of Hunt: General Hunting Season

Bag Limit: Unlimited

Open Hunting Area: Quinault Indian Reservation

Open Season: Open Year Round

Other Restrictions:

Must report location of Mountain Goat harvest to Fish & Game Office.



## **Trapping**

Type of Hunt: Trapping for Fur-bearing Small Game

Bag Limit: Unlimited for Beaver, Bobcat, Coyote, Skunk, Mountain Beaver, Porcupine,

Muskrat, Raccoon, River Otter, and Weasel Family (Long-tailed weasel,

Short-tailed weasel, & Mink)

Open Hunting Area: Quinault Indian Reservation

Open Season: October 1st, 2025 through February 19th, 2026

Additional Restrictions:

No trapping of marten and fisher. No trapping of marine mammals (includes sea otters). No trapping of big game animals.

Trap Restrictions:

- 1. Location of trap-line must be registered with the Fish & Game Office.
- 2. All traps and snares must be legibly marked with the owner's Quinault enrollment number.
- 3. It is unlawful and forbidden for any person to trap for furbearers using:
  - a. A steel foothold trap with a jaw spread greater than seven and a half (7.5) inches.
- b. A No. 3 or larger foothold trap or any foothold trap with an inside jaw spread at dog greater than six inches (6") not having a jaw spacing of at least 3/16 of one inch when the trap is sprung (measurement excludes pads on padded jaw traps) and when the set is not capable of drowning the trapped animal.
- c. Any toothed trap or trap with a protuberance of the facing edge of the jaws that is intended to hold the animal, except pads on padded jaw traps.
- 4. Conibear traps larger than 7x7 inches must be submerged in water.
- 5. All snares used for furbearing animals must be equipped with a break-away device (i.e., shear pin, J hook, S hook, cable ferrule, etc.) located at the junction of the snare lock and the terminal end of the cable and shall release at two-hundred and ninety-five (295) pounds of pressure or less; and the loop size shall not exceed twelve (12) inches in diameter measured from side to side.
- 6. All leg-hold traps must be checked by the owner at least once during each 24-hour period.
- 7. All snares and quick-kill body-grip traps must be checked by the owner not less than once within a 72-hour period.

<sup>\*</sup>Please note that while there is no limit to trapping beavers, beaver dams are an important component of salmon habitat on the QIR. The Wildlife Section requests your assistance in protecting this important resource and promoting improved salmon rearing habitat.



## Designated Hunting



### Roosevelt Elk

Type of Hunt: Designated Hunt

Bag Limit: 0

Open Hunting Area: CLOSED
Open Season: CLOSED

### **Black-Tailed Deer**

Type of Hunt: Designated Hunt
Bag Limit: Buck deer (antlered)

Must be listed on tag as the designated hunter

Open Hunting Area: Quinault Indian Reservation

Open Season: October 15th through December 31st, 2025

#### Additional Restrictions:

Eligible tribal members may select a designated hunter and must supply Fish and Game Office with the Designated Hunter's name when tag is issued. Designated hunters must be listed on tag and have tag present while hunting. Designated hunters must have no title 51 hunting violations within the past 3 years.

Must possess a Designated Hunting Tag. Designated hunters can carry a personal tag and a designated hunting tag at the same time for a total of 2 tags. Designated Hunters may not have more than one designating hunting tag at any given time.

Designated Hunters harvesting meat for the Senior Program, ceremonial purposes, or other pre-specified distribution must be approved by the Fish and Game Office and must have no title 51 violations within the past 3 years.

Designated hunting for elk is not permitted on-reservation for the 2025 hunting season. Designated hunting for other game is permitted on-reservation during the general hunting season.



## Tags & Permits



Enrolled Quinault Tribal Members must apply for and receive a game tag from the FISH AND GAME Office in Taholah or Queets Office prior to hunting big game. You must present a Quinault Tribal Enrollment Card in order to receive a hunting tag. Regular working hours are from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Monday – Friday, excluding holidays.

All big game killed under these regulations must have a 2025 game tag tied to the animal and appropriately punched (notches must be completely cut and removed from tag to make valid) when being transported. The tag must remain with the majority of the animal until the animal is butchered.

#### **DESIGNATED HUNTERS:**

- A) The Fish and Game Office may issue a permit and tags for a tribal hunter to hunt for another person only if the following requirements are met:
  - 1. The designated hunter must be an enrolled member eligible to hunt under these regulations, his or her hunting privileges must not be suspended or revoked, and he or she must not have any Title 51 violations within the past 3 years.
  - 2. The designated hunter may only carry his or her own tag plus one tag for another person benefitting from the hunt, for a maximum of 2 tags on his or her person.
  - 3. The designated hunter may not obtain another tag to hunt for another person before turning in all outstanding tags.
  - 4. The person benefiting from the hunt must be an enrolled tribal member whose hunting privileges have not been suspended or revoked.
  - 5. The person benefitting from the hunt must have his or her name on the tag.
- B) The person benefitting from the hunt may pay the designated hunter the actual expense of the hunt but shall not compensate the designated hunter for the meat.
- C) The Fish and Game Office may select designated hunters and issue additional tags for meat that will be retained for future distribution to elders, the Senior Program, or ceremonial uses.
- D) All filled tags must be reported. It is the responsibility of the designated hunter to report the harvest.
- E) On-reservation designated hunting for elk is not permitted.
- 1. **ENROLLED TRIBAL MEMBERS PROHIBITED FROM CARRYING FIREARMS ARE STRICTLY PROHIBITED FROM HUNTING WITH A FIREARM.** SUCH PERSONS MAY APPOINT A DESIGNATED HUNTER TO HUNT FOR THEM. NO TAG ISSUED TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS PROHITITED FROM CARRY FIREARMS IS VALID, UNLESS THE INDIVIDUAL IS HUNTING WITH A BOW, OR WHEN USED BY THE DESIGNATED HUNTER.
- 2. It is unlawful to shoot at wildlife with a firearm from a vehicle or across or along the maintained portion of a public highway. 51.16.010(d) Firearms carried in vehicles, motor boats or on motorcycles shall not be loaded with live ammunition except for firearms carried by regular law enforcement officers.
- 3. Hunting is not allowed within city limits.



## Prohibited Methods



- 4. Hunting is not allowed within 100 yards of an inhabited dwelling.
- 5. The Fish & Game Office may issue ceremonial permits at any time pursuant to an authorized ceremonial regulation. Ceremonial hunts shall be conducted according to Title 51 Conservation Ordinance.
- 6. The Fish & Game Office may issue special designated hunting permits for community meat distribution at any time pursuant to an authorized regulation. Special designated hunts shall be conducted according to Title 51 Conservation Ordinance.
- 7. Minors (between the ages of 13 and 18) must be:
  - 1) accompanied by an adult when hunting, and
  - 2) pass a hunter's safety class before they can obtain hunting tags.
  - 3) minors must file a copy of their hunter safety card before recieving a tag
- Archery hunters must pass a bow proficiency test before permitted to hunt with a bow on the reservation. A bow proficiency certification must be presented to the Fish & Game Office and archery-approved noted on the issued tag in order to bow hunt on-reservation. Please contact the Fish and Game Office for dates, time, and location of the test administered by QIN Resource Enforcement.
- 9. Archery hunters are prohibited from carrying a rifle on their person or in their vehicle at any time while bow hunting on-reservation. Archery hunters may carry a handgun for protection but are prohibited from hunting with a firearm while bow hunting on-reservation.
- 10. **HUNTING HOURS** Authorized hunting hours for big game during established Seasons are one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset.

#### 11. PROHIBITED HUNTING METHODS

- a) Hunting under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs is prohibited.
- b) Hunting big game with the aid of an artificial light or spotlight is prohibited.
- c) Using aircraft to spot locate or report the location of wildlife for the purpose of hunting, or hunting of big game on the same day you are airborne is prohibited.
- d) Hunting with dogs is illegal unless approved by special regulation.
- e) Hunting with non-Tribal members is illegal on the Quinault Indian Reservation, except under the Guided Bear Hunting Regulations.
- f) Use of drones or any unmanned aircraft to spot, harass, concentrate, chase or aid in any form of hunting is prohibited.

**NOTE:** It is illegal to hunt, kill or possess eagles, osprey, swans, gulls, crows, pelicans and all other non authorized migratory birds.

12. Off Road and Non-Highway Vehicles: No person shall operate a non-highway vehicle or motor boat in such a way as to run down or harass any wildlife or animal. No person shall carry, transport, or convey any loaded weapon in or upon, nor hunt from, any non-highway vehicle except by permit issued by the Quinault Indian Nation Division of Natural Resources. Any non-highway vehicle may be used to travel to and from a hunting area and to transport game. VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION IS A GROSS MISDEMEANOR.



## Data & Game



#### HARVEST MANAGEMENT/DATA COLLECTION

- 13. **REPORTING OF BAGGED GAME:** All wild game killed must be reported to the FISH AND GAME Office within 5 business days of the harvest. Reporting can be either through the online system at https://quinault.nagfa.net/online, by email to qdnrpermits@quinault.org, the office drop-box, in-person, in writing, or by telephone: (360) 276-8215 Ext: 7372. Must provide the following information: Quinault Tribal enrollment number, game tag number, date game taken, game species, sex of game, # of points if applicable, and general location.
- 14. **REPORTING FOR ALL TAGS:** All hunters are encouraged to report on all tags, regardless of whether an animal was harvested. Reporting can be either through the online system at https://quinault.nagfa.net/online, by email to qdnrpermits@quinault.org, the office drop-box, in-person, in writing, or by telephone: (360) 276-8215 Ext: 7372. Must provide the following information: Quinault Tribal enrollment number, game tag number, and if game harvested.
- 15. MANAGEMENT & RESEARCH ANIMALS: Hunters must report if animal is harvested with a VHF/GPS collar or ear tag. The hunter must turn in the collar to the FISH AND GAME Office within 3 business days of the harvest. Ear tags do not need to be turned in but the ear tag number must be included in the harvest report, which can be either through the online system at https://quinault.nagfa.net/online, by email to qdnrpermits@quinault.org, the office drop-box, in-person, in writing, or by telephone: (360) 276-8215 Ext: 7372.
- 16. **LEGAL AREA TO HUNT:** The area this regulation applies to shall be the designated lands open for hunting by regulation within the Quinault Indian Reservation.
- 17. **TRANSPORTATION PERMITS:** Upon bagging game, the hunter must notch the date on the Quinault Indian Nation Hunting Permit to make a valid Game Transport Permit for transport from the field to desired destination.
- 18. **NUISANCE ANIMALS:** Nuisance animals may be trapped and removed or euthanized year round with permission of the QDNR Director or QIN Business Committee if conflict cannot be resolved by other means.
- 19. Trapping of big game animals is unlawful and forbidden, unless authorized as above.



## Guns & Bows



It is unlawful to shoot at wildlife with a firearm or arrow from a vehicle or from across or along the maintained portion of a public highway.

#### **GUN CALIBER**

**Rifles:** Big game must be hunted with a minimum of .243 caliber (6mm) center fire rifle. Rimfire rifles are not legal for big game harvest. The rifle cartridge bullet must weigh more than 85 grains or develops more than 900 foot pounds of energy at 100 yards. Use of full automatic rifles is prohibited.

**Shotguns:** Must use a 20 gauge or larger using shells loaded with slugs or buckshot size #1 or larger for big game hunting. For small game and waterfowl, .410 or .22 shot may be used.

**Handguns:** Big game may be hunted with handguns with a minimum barrel length of 4" inches per manufacturer's specification and fire a minimum .24 centerfire cartridge. Rimfire handguns are not legal for big game. Rimfire handguns (.22 and .177) are legal for small game.

**Loaded Firearms in a Vehicle:** It is illegal to carry, convey, transport, possess or control a loaded shotgun, rifle, or handgun in any motor vehicle. A rifle, shotgun, or handgun containing shells or cartridges in the chamber is considered loaded.

#### **BOW AND ARROW REGULATIONS**

- 1. It is unlawful for any person to hunt big game animals with a bow that possess less than 40 pounds of pull measured at 28 inches or less draw length.
- 2. It is unlawful to hunt big game animals with any arrows other than those having sharp broadhead blade or blades at least 7/8 inches wide or mechanical broad heads. The broadhead must be unbarbed and completely closed at the back end of the blade or blades by a smooth, unbroken surface that starts at the maximum blade width and forms a smooth line toward the feather end of the shaft; such line shall not angle toward the point.
- 3. It is lawful for elders and/or handicap persons to hunt big game animals with a crossbow that has a minimum draw of 125 lbs and a combined bolt broadhead weight of 350 grain.
- 4. Archery hunters must pass a bow proficiency test before permitted to hunt with a bow on the reservation. A bow proficiency certification must be presented to the Fish & Game Office and archery-approved noted on the issued tag in order to bow hunt on-reservation. Please contact the Fish and Game Office for dates, time, and location of the test administered by QIN Resource Enforcement.
- 5. Archery hunters are prohibited from carrying a rifle on their person or in their vehicle at any time while bow hunting on-reservation. Archery hunters may carry a handgun for protection but are prohibited from hunting with a firearm while bow hunting on-reservation.



## Muzzleloaders




#### **MUZZLELOADER REGULATIONS**


- 1. Muzzleloader is a firearm that's loaded from the muzzle and uses black powder or substitute.
- 2. It is unlawful to carry, convey, transport, possess or control a loaded muzzleloader in any motor vehicle. A muzzleloader will be considered loaded if a powder charge and projectile, either shot or single projec tile, are in the bar and the breech or pan is capped or primed.
- 3. It is unlawful to hunt wildlife using a muzzleloader that does not meet these specifications: a. Muzzleloader shotgun or rifle used for deer must be .40 caliber or larger to hunt for deer
  - b. Muzzleloader shotgun or rifle used to hunt all other big game must be .45 caliber or larger.

## Restricted Area: F-17/Lone Mtn Elders & Disabled Only



## Definitions



- BAG LIMIT the maximum number of animals which may be taken, killed or possessed by any person as specified by regulation for any particular period of time and may include limits on size, sex or species.
- 2. BAITING an act to lure or entice animals with food or other lure used to trap animals.
- 3. BIG GAME shall mean bear, cougar, deer, or elk.
- 4. CLOSED AREA any place described or designated by regulation wherein it shall be unlawful to hunt or trap.
- 5. CLOSED SEASON any time during the entire year except the "open season," as specified by regulation.
- 6. ELDER an enrolled Quinault member aged 55 years or older
- 7. FIELD the place where a game harvest has occurred.
- 8. FUR-BEARING ANIMAL beaver, raccoon, rabbit, bobcat and other small game.
- 9. HUNTING to pursue game for food or any effort to possess, kill, injure, capture or disturb any animal or bird.
- 10. NUISANCE ANIMAL an animal that poses an immediate risk to property or public safety.
- 11. OPEN SEASON the time specified by regulation when it shall be lawful to hunt or trap any animal. Each time period specified as an open season shall include the first and last days thereof.
- 12. POINT a projection off any part of the antler measuring at least one inch in length measured from the longest side. Eye guards are antler points if they are at least one inch long
- 13. TITLE 51 –the section of the Quinault Tribal Code of Laws that has been adopted by the Quinault Indian Nation to protect the fish, wildlife and natural resources subject to its jurisdiction and the natural beauty of the Quinault Indian Reservation as amended November, 2003 or later.
